CORE AND SUPPLEMENTARY MATERIALS EXHIBITION AT ONKGOPOTSE TIRO COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL

On May 20, 2024, Onkgopotse Tiro Comprehensive School hosted a groundbreaking Core and Supplementary Materials Exhibition, attracting local primary and secondary school educators from Ngaka Modiri Molema region. Some of the dignitaries who graced the event were SSSA officials of Ngaka Modiri Molema; Caroline Pitse; and HoD of Grade R, Ms Makhotlho. The event aimed to showcase the latest educational resources, that would enhance the learning experience for learners.

The exhibition featured a wide array of core and supplementary educational materials. Several Publishers and educational companies presented textbooks, supplementary materials, digital resources, interactive tools, and other learning aids designed to support the curriculum and variety of learning styles. Attendees had the opportunity to interact with publishers and enquired about multimedia resources that make learning more engaging and effective.



Throughout the day, the Setswana National Lexicography Unit (SEFALA) and SANLU Publishers provided attendees with hands-on experiences and practical insights into using their products in the classroom.

The Officials in charge of the Learner Teacher Support Materials (LTSM) advised teachers to order stationery 100%, and supplementary materials which are budgeted for 2024/2025 financial

year. However, schools were advised to buy supplementary materials with what's left after buying stationary.

A series of exhibitions of this nature were imminent in the week of the 20th to the 24th across the length and breadth of the province, including two days in the following week, that is, the 27th and 28th prior to the day of the Elections.

SEFALA contingent spread themselves to support the Publisher in all the four districts of the North West Province, namely, Ngaka Modiri Molema, Dr Kenneth Kaunda, Dr Ruth Segomotsi Mompati and Bojanala.
